1 WHEREAS, The Honorable Oscar G. Ortiz, mayor of Port Arthur, 2 has been named the 2006 Person of the Year by the Quota

International Club of Southeast Texas for his exemplary leadership

during and after Hurricane Rita; and

WHEREAS, The youngest of eight children, Oscar Ortiz grew up in Port Arthur and graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School in 1955; he went on to serve his country in Korea as a radar specialist with the U.S. Air Force; following his military service, he gained experience in a variety of fields, including law enforcement, carpentry, and business, eventually owning three Gingiss Formal Wear stores and serving on the Gingiss International Advertising Board; along with his wife, Carol, he continues to operate a retail store and is a business development consultant; and

WHEREAS, Inspired to enter politics out of allegiance to his hometown, Mr. Ortiz served as the District 3 city council member before being elected mayor in 1998; his first term was characterized by an economic boom, initiated in part by his successful efforts to award a tax abatement to BASF/AtoFina for the construction of a steam cracker unit; he was subsequently reelected twice, and in the years since, he has continued to make job creation a priority with incentives for companies such as Motiva Enterprises, which alone is slated to bring hundreds of jobs to the area; moreover, he was instrumental in passing a property tax
