RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The city of Euless lost a beloved resident and 2 public servant with the passing of Willie Mae McCormick on January 3 13, 2007, at the age of 98; and

WHEREAS, Born on October 17, 1908, the former Willie Mae Ward grew up on a cotton farm in Pleasant Ridge, the sixth of nine children; she attended a one-room schoolhouse through the 10th grade and completed her education at Jewett High School; she went on to become the first person in her family to attend college, earning a bachelor's degree from the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor in 1929, followed by a master's degree in chemistry from Hardin-Simmons University in 1932; during World War II, she worked as a chemist for the Dow Chemical Company in Freeport and subsequently built a 20-year career as engineer an at Ling-Temco-Vought in Grand Prairie; and

WHEREAS, Following her retirement from LTV in 1973, Mrs. McCormick became the first woman elected to the Euless City Council, which she served for 12 years, including 10 as mayor pro tem; known for her diligence and keen intellect, she advocated for equal pay for female employees and, long after her public service ended, she continued to send handwritten letters of thanks and congratulations to city staff; her civic leadership also included extensive service with the Historical Preservation Committee and the Library Board; and
