RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The death of the Reverend James Benjamin Thomas of 2 Galveston on March 16, 2007, at the age of 82, has saddened the many 3 individuals who were privileged to know this remarkable man; and

WHEREAS, Fondly known as "the Rev," James Thomas devoted many years of his life to serving his fellow citizens; he distinguished himself on the Galveston City Council for nearly two decades and was a leading advocate for the Galveston Housing Authority and a valued member of numerous civic organizations; and

9 WHEREAS, A former president of the Galveston chapter of the 10 NAACP and a lifelong civil rights activist, Reverend Thomas played 11 a role in establishing Juneteenth as a state holiday; and

12 WHEREAS, He was a longtime proponent of education who helped 13 to integrate local schools, and he worked hard throughout his life 14 to encourage young people to pursue educational opportunities; he also organized the city's midnight basketball league, a program 15 that created a safe and positive environment for kids and helped 16 keep them off the street; in 2004, the City of Galveston and the 17 18 Parks and Recreation Department named a recreation center at Wright Cuney Park in his honor; and 19

20 WHEREAS, A World War II veteran, Reverend Thomas worked for 21 the U.S. Post Office for more than 30 years; in 1978, he became the 22 pastor of Market Street Missionary Baptist Church, where he 23 encouraged the congregation as well as youth and low-income 24 families in the community to be "educated, emancipated, and

1 excellent"; he retired from the ministry in 2002; and

2 WHEREAS, Beloved for his many good works, Reverend Thomas 3 lived his life in service to others, endeavoring to make the world 4 around him a better place; although his death has brought great 5 sorrow to the Galveston community, his life was an inspiring 6 example of the good that one person can accomplish; now, therefore, 7 be it
