R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Mark Misage, a physics teacher at Westlake High
2 School in Austin, has won a 2007 Siemens Award for Advanced
3 Placement; and

4 WHEREAS, Established in 1998, the Siemens Foundation awards
5 nearly \$2 million every year in college scholarships for students,
6 and its Advanced Placement awards program recognizes exceptional
7 achievement in science, math, and technology; and

8 WHEREAS, The foundation also honors superlative teaching,
9 awarding \$1,000 to a teacher from each of the 50 states; educators
10 with a minimum of five years' teaching experience in math, science,
11 or technology are chosen for their commitment to excellence and
12 their dedication to their students and to the Advanced Placement
13 program; and

14 WHEREAS, The only teacher in Texas to receive this
15 prestigious award in 2007, Mark Misage is a 1989 graduate of The
16 University of Texas at Austin; he has taught at Westlake High School
17 for 18 years and is one of the leaders of the school's award-winning
18 AP program, which was named the strongest AP physics program in the
19 world among schools with enrollments larger than 1,000 by the
20 College Board in 2005; and

21 WHEREAS, Throughout his career as a teacher, Mark Misage has
22 demonstrated an innovative spirit, a steadfast commitment to his
23 students, and an enthusiasm for his subject, and his record of
24 success as an educator makes him an excellent choice for this

1 national award; now, therefore, be it

2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
3 Legislature hereby congratulate Mark Misage of Westlake High School
4 for winning a 2007 Siemens Award for Advanced Placement and extend
5 to him best wishes for continued achievement; and, be it further
