RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Early Childhood Caries is the most common chronic 2 disease among children, affecting more than half of elementary 3 school students; and

WHEREAS, The effects of ECC are felt especially among 4 children in low-income families, with 80 percent of ECC cases 5 occurring in children at or below the poverty line, and with those 6 children having nearly 12 times more restricted-activity days 7 of dental-related illnesses than 8 because children from higher-income families; in addition, fewer than one in five 9 Medicaid-covered children receives even one preventive dental 10 11 service per year; and

WHEREAS, ECC is detrimental to the health, life, and education of the thousands of children affected by it, and the disease is damaging to the education and health systems of the state, causing a tremendous drain on public funds; and
