5 WHEREAS, Born on January 9, 1949, Mr. Woodard was a graduate 6 of Hampton University in Virginia; he enjoyed a successful 30-year 7 career in finance, marketing, and human resources, dedicating much 8 of his work to promoting diversity in corporate America; and

9 WHEREAS, The former president and CEO of a consulting firm in 10 Georgia, Mr. Woodard came to Dell, Inc., in 2000; the Austin-based 11 company's first vice president for global diversity and chief 12 ethics, privacy, and compliance officer, he helped shape Dell into 13 a leading employer of minorities; and

WHEREAS, His efforts were instrumental in earning Dell the 14 top award for workplace diversity from the U.S. Department of 15 Labor, the Secretary of Labor's Opportunity Award, a ranking as one 16 of the Top 20 Best Corporate Citizens, and the 2005 Central and 17 18 South Texas Minority Business Council Corporation of the Year award; Mr. Woodard's achievements in creating opportunities for 19 minorities were recognized by the Austin Area Urban League in 2006 20 21 with the Whitney M. Young, Jr., Award; and

22 WHEREAS, He also gave back to his community as a trustee for 23 Huston-Tillotson University and as a member of the Congressional 24 Black Caucus Foundation Board, the Ethics and Compliance Officers

Association, the Catalyst board, and ELC; moreover, he was a devoted congregant of David Chapel Missionary Baptist Church, where he served as a deacon and Sunday school teacher and where he and his wife, Suzanne, led Crown Financial Ministries; and
