WHEREAS, The 16th fastest growing county in the nation, 4 5 Williamson County is home to nearly 350,000 residents, and that number is expected to double by 2015 and exceed one million by 2020; 6 Leander's population has grown by an estimated 85 percent since 7 2000, and Hutto has experienced phenomenal growth, with its 8 population estimated to have increased by over 1,200 percent in 9 that same period; the county is among the state's leaders in 10 household income, yet its housing costs remain well below the 11 12 national average, and the crime rate is one of the lowest in the 13 nation; and
