1 WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times and
2 meaningful accomplishments remain to comfort the family and friends
3 of Nathaniel Williams of Dallas, who passed away on April 10, 2007;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, Born and raised in Waco, Mr. Williams graduated from
6 A. J. Moore High School in 1954 and earned a bachelor's degree from
7 Wiley College and a master's degree from Texas A&M University; he
8 began his career as a teacher and coach in Terrell before moving to
9 Dallas in 1960; he served as a basketball coach for M. B. Lamar and
10 William Brown Miller Elementary Schools and Oliver Wendell Holmes
11 Middle School, leading a number of teams to the city championships;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Williams went on to serve area schoolchildren as
14 an administrator with the Dallas Independent School District for
15 many years, beginning with a tenure as the assistant principal of
16 Pearl C. Anderson Middle School; he completed the Mott Institute
17 Community School Leadership Program and later established the first
18 community education program in Texas; before his retirement in
19 1994, he served as director of the district's Adult Basic Education
20 Program; and

21 WHEREAS, In addition to his professional achievements, Mr.
22 Williams was active in his community as a commissioner of the
23 Comanche District of the Circle Ten Council of the Boy Scouts of
24 America, and his contributions earned him scouting's highest honor,

1 the Silver Beaver Award; a valued congregant of St. Elizabeth
2 Catholic Church, he also shared his time with the Connecting Link of
3 Trinity Chapter of The Links, Inc., Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity, and
4 the alumni associations of Wiley College and Texas A&M University;

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Williams was a devoted husband and loving
7 father; he shared 43 years of marriage with his wife, Ann Ferrell
8 Williams, and the couple were blessed with a daughter, Angelia
9 Nicole, who was said to be the apple of her father's eye; and

10 WHEREAS, To all his endeavors, Nathaniel Williams brought an
11 unshakeable integrity, a boundless capacity for hard work, and a
12 profound desire to make a positive difference in the lives of
13 others, and he will long be fondly remembered by the countless
14 people whom he inspired; now, therefore, be it
