WHEREAS, Born on March 6, 1947, in Conroe, Susan Cranford 4 5 began an outstanding career in criminal justice in 1973 as a teacher of incarcerated individuals for the Windham School District; she 6 went on to serve as a substance abuse counselor and an assistant 7 warden before rising to the rank of senior warden, in which capacity 8 she developed innovative programs for female offenders and worked 9 for nearly a decade; in 1994, she was appointed assistant director 10 11 of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice State Jail Division and 12 subsequently served as the director of the TDCJ Community Justice Assistance Division; she retired in 2001 as director of the TDCJ 13 14 Private Facilities Oversight and Monitoring Division; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Cranford further distinguished herself 15 as president of the Texas Corrections Association and as a member of 16 American Correctional Association's Congress 17 the Planning 18 Committee; over the years, she garnered numerous honors, including an Outstanding Woman in Texas Government Award and an Outstanding 19 Woman in Texas Government Pioneer Spirit Award; moreover, she 20 21 received the Clarence A. Stevenson Award in 2003 for her lifetime contributions to community corrections; and 22

WHEREAS, Known for her exuberant and cheerful spirit, Ms.
Cranford was guided by her belief in the potential for anyone to

achieve success, and she encouraged people to strive for their 1 2 best; in addition, her able leadership in the field of criminal 3 justice helped open doors for more women to join the profession; and 4 WHEREAS, Susan Cranford earned the respect and admiration of 5 friends and colleagues alike for her exceptional accomplishments, 6 her enthusiasm and dedication, and her genuine compassion for others; although she will be deeply missed, she leaves behind a 7 8 legacy that will continue to inspire others for many years to come; 9 now, therefore, be it
