- the business until 1980, when he sold it to the Pepsi-Cola Company;
- 16 he and his wife, Virginia Ruth Clarke, moved to Clarke Ranch in
- western Kerr County in 1972; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Involved in many civic and community organizations,
- 19 Mr. Clarke was a member and former president of the Conroe Rotary
- 20 Club, a member and past president of the Montgomery County Chamber
- of Commerce, a life member of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo,
- 22 a past president of the Houston Hereford Club, and a 23-year member
- 23 of the board of directors for the Kerr County Soil and Water
- 24 Conservation District, a post from which he retired in December
