1 WHEREAS, Alfred Huntsberry, Jr., of Dallas has been named a
2 winner of the 2007 Outstanding Texan Award in the category of
3 business by the Texas Legislative Black Caucus; and

5 impact they make in their communities, and the dedicated service
6 that Mr. Huntsberry has provided as a businessman has greatly
7 enhanced the lives of many individuals in the Dallas area; and

8 WHEREAS, Born in Abbeville, Louisiana, Mr. Huntsberry moved
9 to Dallas in 1958 and became interested in the printing business; he
10 learned the trade, including how to repair the machinery, so that he
11 could open his own business, and he started ALP Printing Company in
12 1974; and

13 WHEREAS, Over the years, Mr. Huntsberry has contributed his
14 time and talents to various community organizations; a member of
15 the Dallas Black Chamber of Commerce, he has been honored with many
16 awards, including ones from the Park South YMCA, the Sickle Cell
17 Anemia Foundation of Dallas, and the *Elite News*, and he was the
18 recipient of a Legacy Award in business by the Urban League of
19 Greater Dallas; in addition, he serves on the deacon board and is
20 chairman emeritus of the trustee board for Salem Institutional
21 Baptist Church, where he is also a member; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Huntsberry stands as an inspiring example of how
23 one person can better a community through professional dedication
24 and civic activism, and the Outstanding Texan commendation is a

1 fitting recognition of his exemplary achievements; now, therefore,
