RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Proud residents of Bastrop are celebrating the 175th
 anniversary of their city on June 9, 2007; and

3 WHEREAS, In 1804, when the Tonkawa and the Comanche still 4 lived and hunted in the area, the Spanish governor of the region, 5 Manuel Antonio Cordero y Bustamante, established a fort where the 6 road between San Antonio and Nacogdoches crossed the Colorado 7 River; the fort was called Puesta del Colorado; and

8 WHEREAS, At about the same time, a fugitive embezzler from 9 the Netherlands named Philip Hendrik Nering Bogel who was passing 10 himself off as "the Baron of Bastrop" settled in San Antonio; in 11 1823, the "Baron" obtained permission to set up a German colony on 12 the site of the old fort; and

WHEREAS, The colony failed, but four years later Stephen F.
Austin located a settlement of 100 families on the site; on June 8,
15 1832, the town was officially platted and named Bastrop; and

16 WHEREAS, Renamed two years later as Mina after a Mexican 17 hero, the town had grown to 400 residents and was the business and 18 political center for the region by the time it was incorporated and 19 renamed Bastrop on December 18, 1837; and

20 WHEREAS, With the Lost Pine Forest nearby, Bastrop became a 21 center for the lumber industry; when Austin became capital of the 22 Texas Republic in 1839, Bastrop supplied the timber for the city; 23 over the years, Bastrop has continued to depend on timber as well as 24 upon petroleum, cotton, pecans, and coal as mainstays of its

1 economy; and

2 WHEREAS, As one of the oldest and most historic towns in the 3 Lone Star State, Bastrop has 131 houses and buildings, many of them 4 recently restored, listed on the National Historic Register; among 5 the highlights are the Victorian-style Bastrop Opera House, which 6 was built in 1889, the Bastrop County Historical Society Museum, 7 housed in the 1850 Cornelson-Fehr house, and Bastrop's picturesque 8 Main Street, which features antique shops, specialty stores, and 9 restaurants in century-old buildings; the Iron Bridge over the Colorado River was built in 1890 and has been converted to a park 10 with picnic tables, benches, and walkways; and 11

WHEREAS, Celebrating their rich and colorful past as they look forward to a bright future, the people of Bastrop may take special pride in their city's central place in the history and culture of Texas; now, therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas 17 Legislature hereby congratulate the city of Bastrop on the 175th 18 anniversary of its founding and extend to its citizens best wishes 19 for a fine birthday party and for their continued prosperity.
