

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life came to a close on April 12,
2 2007, with the passing of noted Del Rio civic leader Jack L.
3 Richardson; and

4 WHEREAS, Born in 1929 in Wichita, Kansas, Mr. Richardson
5 joined the U.S. Army at the age of 17 and served his country as an
6 anti-aircraft gun crewman, classification specialist, and
7 cryptograph technician; and

8 WHEREAS, This distinguished gentleman led a life of
9 exceptional service to his country, state, and community; following
10 his departure from the army, he worked with Boeing Aircraft before
11 joining the U.S. Border Patrol in Del Rio in 1953; his 31-year
12 tenure with the agency would take him from Texas to Michigan to
13 California and back to the Lone Star State in 1965; he eventually
14 settled in Del Rio and was promoted to the position of chief patrol
15 agent; and

16 WHEREAS, Following his retirement from the Border Patrol, Mr.
17 Richardson continued to give of his time and talents to the
18 betterment of his community; as the director of Del Rio
19 International Airport, he was highly instrumental in securing
20 financial support for its expansion and for the improvement of its
21 services; in addition, his work as a grant writer for the City of
22 Del Rio enabled the acquisition of funding for numerous beneficial
23 projects, including a new fire station and a baseball and soccer
24 complex; and

1 WHEREAS, Known for his wit, tenacity, and professionalism,
2 Jack Richardson built a life that was remarkably rich in
3 accomplishments and meaningful service to others; although he will
4 be deeply missed, he will always be remembered with the greatest
5 respect and admiration; now, therefore, be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
7 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Jack L. Richardson and
8 extend sympathy to the members of his family: to his wife of 58
9 years, Helen Louise Richardson; to his daughters, Mary Rene
10 Richardson and Leigh Ann Lindsey and her husband, Dr. Terry M.
11 Lindsey; to his grandchildren, Jackson, T. Houston, Austin,
12 Laramie, and Clovis Lindsey, Sarah Angol, and Raegen Mundy; to his
13 sister, Casey Marlnee; to his five great-grandchildren; and to his
14 other relatives and friends; and, be it further

15 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be

17 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Jack
18 Richardson.
