RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The friends and family of U.S. Army Corporal Ryan 2 Alan Bishop of Tyler suffered an immeasurable loss with the death of this valiant soldier in Iraq on April 14, 2007, at the age of 32; and 3 WHEREAS, Assigned to the 4th Battalion, 31st Infantry 4 Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division (Light 5 Infantry), at Fort Drum, New York, Corporal Bishop was mortally 6 wounded when an improvised explosive device was detonated while he 7 was on patrol in Baghdad; a specialist at the time of his death, he 8 was posthumously promoted to the rank of corporal and awarded a 9 Purple Heart and Bronze Star; and 10

WHEREAS, Born on May 2, 1974, in Tyler, Ryan Bishop graduated 11 12 in 1992 from Marshall High School, where two years earlier he had played on the state football championship team; he went on to earn 13 14 an associate's degree in surveying from Tyler Junior College and to pursue a successful career as a land surveyor; in 2005, inspired by 15 a friend's service in the military, he enlisted in the army and 16 subsequently earned the marksman badge during basic training at 17 18 Fort Benning, Georgia; motivated by a strong sense of duty and the desire to help those in need, he was deployed to Iraq in August 19 2006; and 20

21 WHEREAS, Corporal Bishop was beloved by all who knew him for 22 his charisma, wit, and generosity; an outdoors enthusiast, he 23 enjoyed cooking and listening to music, and he had a knack for 24 telling lively stories; and

6 WHEREAS, Through his selfless devotion to duty, honor, and 7 his country, Corporal Bishop embodied the highest ideals of the 8 U.S. armed services, and his memory will be forever treasured by 9 those who shared in the blessing of his life; now, therefore, be it

10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas 11 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Corporal Ryan Alan 12 Bishop and extend sincere sympathy to the members of his family: to 13 his wife, Melanie Bishop; to his father, Charlie Bishop; to his 14 brother, Paul Bishop, and his wife, Wendy; to his grandmothers, 15 Freddie Ruth Bishop and Phyllis O'Neal Carter; and to his other 16 relatives and many friends; and, be it further
