1 WHEREAS, Countless lives were touched by the caring nature of
2 philanthropist Martha Jane Huddle of Baytown, who died on March 4,
3 2007, at the age of 88; and

4 WHEREAS, Martha Jane Huddle was born in Caldwell on January
5 14, 1919; she graduated from Sam Houston State University with a
6 degree in business and was initially employed at Citizen's National
7 Bank; deciding to change careers, she earned her teaching
8 certification and a master's degree in education from the
9 University of Houston, and she taught second grade at Alamo
10 Elementary School for 22 years before retiring in 1986; and

11 WHEREAS, Along with her husband, Douglas Huddle, Jr., Mrs.
12 Huddle was a steadfast supporter of Lee College, and the couple
13 served on the Friends of Lee College board and the library board;
14 to recognize Mrs. Huddle's many contributions to the institution,
15 Lee College named a campus courtyard in her honor; her volunteer
16 efforts also extended to other local organizations, including the
17 American Cancer Society and the Kiwanis Club of Baytown, which has
18 created a scholarship fund in her memory that will be offered to
19 students at Lee College; and

20 WHEREAS, Held in the highest regard by all who knew her,
21 Martha Jane Huddle brought a generosity of spirit and an unfailing
22 integrity to all of her endeavors, and she built a life that was
23 remarkably rich, filled with family, friends, and numerous
24 accomplishments; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
2 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Martha Jane Huddle and
3 extend deepest sympathy to the members of her family: to her husband
4 of 64 years, Douglas O. Huddle, Jr.; to her children, Cindy
5 McGlothlin and her husband, Pat, and Doug Huddle and his wife,
6 Diane; to her grandchildren, Shawn and Tami McGlothlin, Benjamin
7 Jackson, Brian and Shannon Hall, and Dr. Timothy J. Jackson; to her
8 great-grandchildren, Kayli, Brianna, and Aidan McGlothlin, Saige
9 Wimberly, Kayla Huddle, and Brenden Hall; to her sister, Georgia
