WHEREAS, Working with a single computer at their first world-class competition, the UT Dallas team placed 14th out of 88 teams, completing five problems in the allotted time; this impressive showing made UT Dallas one of only three teams from American universities to place in the top 20; coached by UT Dallas associate professor Ivor Page, the team members are all students at the Erik Jonsson School of Engineering and Computer Science; and
