R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Governor Rick Perry appointed nine students in
2 February 2007 to represent their peers as members of Texas public
3 university boards of regents; and

4 WHEREAS, For more than 40 years, the students of the colleges
5 and universities of Texas have sought representation on the
6 governing bodies of their institutions; and

7 WHEREAS, With the passage of Senate Bill 34 during the 79th
8 Legislative Session, that longtime goal became a reality; selected
9 by a process that includes the student body, student government,
10 university administration, and the governor, student regents
11 represent a wide diversity of backgrounds and viewpoints and offer
12 university leadership a different perspective on such important
13 issues as tuition and fee increases, faculty decisions, and budget
14 matters; and

15 WHEREAS, The outstanding young men and women currently
16 serving as student regents are Magdalena Manzano, Texas State
17 University System; Ebtasam Attaya Islam, Texas Tech University
18 System; Christopher Sharpe, University of Houston System; Randal
19 Matthew Camarillo, University of Texas System; Diana Schulz,
20 University of North Texas; Christianne Kellett, Texas Woman's
21 University; Jason A. York, Midwestern State University; Stephanie
22 Tracy, Stephen F. Austin State University; and Cassidy Ann Daniel,
23 Texas A&M University System; and

24 WHEREAS, These students devote long hours and work hard to

1 ensure that the wants and needs of their fellow students are heard
2 and addressed, and they are truly deserving of recognition for
3 their efforts; now, therefore, be it

4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
5 Legislature hereby commend the student members of the boards of
6 regents of the public universities of Texas for their contributions
7 to the welfare of their fellow students and extend to them sincere
8 best wishes for the future; and, be it further

9 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
10 prepared for the students as an expression of high regard by the
11 Texas House of Representatives.
