WHEREAS, Although Mr. Beckendorff was a farmer and rancher at heart, he supported his family as an operator with Humble Oil and Refining Company and maintained livestock on the side; after an early retirement from the Exxon Company, he owned and operated a slaughterhouse, where he made and sold smoked sausage; he subsequently worked for Daniel Industries before retiring for good some years later; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Beckendorff derived great pleasure from singing and playing guitar in the Joyful Noise Makers, a musical group that performed at nursing homes, and he remained active doing yard work for local widows; a faithful member of the First United Methodist Church of Katy, he served on the board of stewards for 10 years and was often the first person to arrive on Sunday mornings to make coffee; in addition to occasional fishing trips, he enjoyed reading the Bible and newspaper daily; and

WHEREAS, Recognized as a lifetime member of the Katy FFA,
