## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Descendants of Alvino Soza are gathering in the Brazos Valley of Texas for a family reunion on June 30, 2007, and 2 this happy occasion provides a fitting opportunity to pay tribute 3 to the legacy of this esteemed Texan; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Alvino Soza was born to Antonio Soza and Maria Inez 6 Escobar on December 16, 1860; following in his father's footsteps, he was instrumental in settling and developing land in Starr 7 County, known as Porcion 76, a portion of land granted by the king 8 of Spain to Jose Miguel Antonio Ramirez and Maria Rita Lopez de 9 Jaen; the land later belonged to the stepson of Mr. Ramirez, Jose 10 11 Maria Escobar, who became known as the Patriarch of Porcion 76; and 12 WHEREAS, During his lifetime, Mr. Soza helped to establish a 13 village along the Rio Grande, named Los Escobares in honor of the 14 patriarch; Mr. Soza and other elders in the village outlined the requirements for a unified community, and following his selection 15 by his peers as commissioner, he was charged with enforcing the 16 agreement; highly respected for his insights and advice, he also 17 served as a peace officer and counselor, assisting in the 18 resolution of various disputes, especially those involving open 19 community property, as a large part of the area was undivided and 20 21 sparsely populated; in 2006, after more than a century of growth, 22 the village was chartered as the city of Escobares; and WHEREAS, Mr. Soza and the other settlers, both alone and in 23

caravan, traveled periodically by wagon and horseback to and from

- 1 their ranches and land holdings, located several miles north of the
- 2 village, to work the land and attend to their livestock, and in
- 3 drought conditions, when stock tanks went dry, drove their
- 4 livestock several miles to the Rio Grande for watering; and
- 5 WHEREAS, A man of honesty and integrity, with a strong work
- 6 ethic, Mr. Soza lived in a time when a man's word was golden and
- 7 transactions were often made on only a handshake; he was a man of
- 8 strong faith and unfaltering optimism as well, both of which
- 9 virtues he instilled in his children and grandchildren, and today
- 10 his descendants give back to their communities, state, and nation
- 11 as military service members, civil servants, first responders,
- 12 health care professionals, teachers, law enforcement officials,
- 13 attorneys, and entrepreneurs; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Carrying on the proud tradition of Alvino Soza, the
- 15 Soza family continues to contribute to the betterment of the Lone
- 16 Star State, and its members may take justifiable pride in their
- 17 myriad accomplishments and rich heritage; now, therefore, be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas
- 19 Legislature hereby honor the organizers and participants of the
- 20 Soza family reunion and extend to all those involved sincere best
- 21 wishes for a memorable celebration; and, be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 23 prepared for the Soza family as an expression of high regard by the
- 24 Texas House of Representatives.
