

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The 90th birthday of an esteemed Texan is indeed a
2 joyous occasion, and on November 28, 2006, the Reverend Claude
3 William Black, Jr., celebrated this special milestone in his life;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, Born in San Antonio in 1916, Reverend Black attended
6 Morehouse College and Andover Newton Theological School; he served
7 as pastor of Calvary Baptist Church in Massachusetts and St.
8 Matthew Baptist Church in Corpus Christi before joining Mt. Zion
9 First Baptist Church in San Antonio in 1949; he remained at the helm
10 of Mt. Zion for nearly 50 years; and

11 WHEREAS, An inspiring leader both in and out of the pulpit,
12 Reverend Black advocated for equal treatment of minorities during
13 the 1950s and 1960s, organizing and leading civil rights marches
14 throughout the state; in 1973, he was elected to the San Antonio
15 City Council, on which he served four terms and became the first
16 black mayor pro tem; moreover, he founded the city's first credit
17 union for African Americans and served as president of the Baptist
18 Ministers Union of San Antonio; and

19 WHEREAS, Reverend Black's efforts in behalf of the city of
20 San Antonio, his steadfast faith, and his commitment to his fellow
21 Texans have earned him the lasting respect of countless
22 individuals, and it is a pleasure to honor him for nine decades of a
23 life well lived; now, therefore, be it
