

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Williamson County adult probation director Rick
2 Zinsmeyer is retiring in 2007 after serving his community with
3 distinction for nearly 30 years; and

4 WHEREAS, When Mr. Zinsmeyer started in adult probation in
5 1977, the small department supervised 700 criminal offenders who
6 would slip their reports under the door, annual fees collected
7 totaled no more than \$12,000, and all of the department's paperwork
8 could fit into two drawers of a filing cabinet; and

9 WHEREAS, Then only in his early 20s, Mr. Zinsmeyer took over
10 the department in 1978, determined to leave it in better shape than
11 he had found it; under his skilled and steady leadership, the
12 Williamson County adult probation program has expanded to match the
13 rapid growth of Williamson County, and it has become one of the
14 finest probation departments in the state; and

15 WHEREAS, Now employing 105 people, the department supervises
16 5,000 probationers and collects almost \$5 million a year in fees;
17 moreover, Mr. Zinsmeyer has instituted a number of programs to help
18 ensure the safety of the community as well as the successful reentry
19 of probationers into society; and

20 WHEREAS, Through his dedication, drive, and vision, Rick
21 Zinsmeyer has served Williamson County well for nearly 30 years,
22 earning the lasting respect of other law enforcement professionals
23 and the gratitude of his fellow citizens; now, therefore, be it
