R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Ed Brady is retiring from his position as president
2 and CEO of the Metrocrest Chamber of Commerce, bringing to a close
3 an exceptional tenure with the organization of almost 13 years and a
4 career in civic service that has spanned some 30 years; and

5 WHEREAS, The Metrocrest chamber serves the communities of
6 Addison, Carrollton, and Farmers Branch, and Mr. Brady has overseen
7 the organization's economic development activities and programs
8 and worked with area business leaders and government officials in
9 promoting the chamber's objectives; whether developing and
10 implementing successful marketing and fund-raising campaigns or
11 managing the staff, volunteers, and budget, he has consistently
12 demonstrated a commitment to excellence; and

13 WHEREAS, This native Texan brought to the Metrocrest position
14 a wealth of experience garnered from his years of service in
15 municipal government and with other chambers of commerce; he
16 previously worked as the city manager, assistant city manager, and
17 director of economic development for the City of DeSoto and as the
18 president and CEO of that community's chamber of commerce; in
19 addition, he served as the president and CEO of the Bryan-College
20 Station Chamber of Commerce and as the executive vice president and
21 director of membership for the Austin Chamber of Commerce; and

22 WHEREAS, The economic vitality of our state depends on
23 individuals like Mr. Brady, whose vision and inspiring leadership
24 have greatly benefited each of the communities he has so ably

1 served, and he may reflect with pride on his many achievements; now,
2 therefore, be it

4 Legislature hereby congratulate Ed Brady on his retirement as
