5 WHEREAS, Founded in New York in 1963, 100 Black Men of America 6 is a service organization dedicated to improving the quality of 7 life of members of the African American community; since its 8 establishment, the organization has grown to include 106 chapters 9 and more than 10,000 members nationwide who work with some 100,000 10 young people annually; and

WHEREAS, The group is particularly committed to ensuring the intellectual, spiritual, and moral development of African American youth through individual and group mentoring; BMOA members act as role models, providing goals, life skills, and encouragement for young people in the program; and

16 WHEREAS, The BMOA chapter in Houston was founded in 1995 by 17 Ben Piggot and 12 other charter members; today the organization is 18 carrying its message of leadership and achievement primarily to 19 young men between the ages of 11 and 17 under the direction of 20 current president and vice chancellor of the University of Houston 21 System, John Rudley; and
