WHEREAS, The foundation's community outreach programs 17 18 include informative and educational presentations aimed at teaching life skills; topics include diabetes education, gang 19 awareness, parenting skills, AIDS prevention, and learning to set 20 21 goals and build self-esteem; available in both English and Spanish, 22 these presentations are offered to schools, student clubs, parent groups, juvenile detention centers, and teacher workshops in 23 Nueces, Duval, Brooks, Jim Wells, and Kleberg Counties; and 24
