King High School and graduated in 1996; soon after earning his diploma, Mr. Santiago chose to serve his country as a member of the U.S. Navy, and for the next four years, he distinguished himself as a seaman of great diligence and ability; and

WHEREAS, Petty Officer Santiago was stationed for three years at the Charlestown Navy Yard as a crew member on the historic USS Constitution, the oldest commissioned warship in the world; his devoted service as a cook and his upbeat personality won him many friends among his fellow sailors on "Old Ironsides," and one of the ship's galleys was named in his honor following his death; and

WHEREAS, After joining the crew of the *Cole*, Petty Officer Santiago ably supported that ship's vital assignments around the globe; though he relished the adventure of his navy duty, Ronchester Santiago was looking forward to the next chapter in his life and had plans to study electrical engineering at The University of Texas; and
