WHEREAS, In her stage production Achieving the Dream, Ms. King played several characters in the civil rights movement; she skillfully portrayed historical figures on film as well, playing Rosa Parks in the TV movie King, the wife of Malcolm X in the film 17 Death of a Prophet, and Medgar Evers' daughter in the film Ghosts of Mississippi; and 19

WHEREAS, Ms. King regularly gave inspirational motivational lecture-performances for Fortune 500 corporations and at church and civic events, conferences, and universities; she served on the Partnership Council of Habitat for Humanity and was a member of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and the
