1 WHEREAS, The student volunteers of Midland Teen Court provide
2 an important civic service by taking part in a juvenile justice
3 program that benefits area residents and also provides valuable
4 experience for the young participants who fill the courtroom
5 assignments; and

6 WHEREAS, Using judges, lawyers, and teen volunteers to offer
7 "restorative justice" to peers, Teen Court hears cases involving
8 teenage defendants who have plead guilty to a Class C misdemeanor;

10 WHEREAS, Ten graduating seniors from Midland ISD volunteered
11 to become part of an actual courtroom, acting as the prosecution,
12 defense, and jury, and their contributions to this important
13 program earned them a total of \$12,250 in scholarships;

15 Sydney D. Freeman, Arun Ramkhelawan, Ainsley Anne Rea, and
16 Stephanie Michelle Strauss from Lee High School, and Ismail Shakoor

18 Martinez, and Meagan Rachelle Mowles from Midland High School; and
