1           WHEREAS, Words cannot adequately express the heartache felt  
2 at the loss of U.S. Army Corporal Anthony M. Bradshaw of New  
3 Braunfels, who died while bravely serving his country on May 6,  
4 2007, at the age of 21; and

5           WHEREAS, Assigned to the 5th Battalion, 20th Infantry  
6 Regiment, 3rd Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, Corporal Bradshaw  
7 was one of six soldiers killed when a roadside bomb exploded near  
8 their vehicle during combat operations in Baquba, Iraq; and

9           WHEREAS, Americans owe a profound debt to our nation's  
10 servicemen and servicewomen, whose courageous efforts and enormous  
11 sacrifices are deserving of their fellow citizens' deepest respect  
12 and gratitude; and

13           WHEREAS, Exemplifying the highest ideals of the U.S. armed  
14 forces, Anthony M. Bradshaw inspired others with his fortitude,  
15 tenacity, and courage; although his death leaves a void in the lives  
16 of his loved ones, they will forever carry memories of this heroic  
17 Texan close in their hearts; now, therefore, be it

18           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas  
19 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Corporal Anthony M.  
20 Bradshaw and extend deepest sympathy to all those who mourn his  
21 passing; and, be it further

22           RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be  
23 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of  
24 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of U.S.  
25 Army Corporal Anthony M. Bradshaw.
