1           WHEREAS, Words cannot adequately express the heartache felt  
2 at the loss of U.S. Army Sergeant Glenn D. Hicks, Jr., of College  
3 Station, who died while bravely serving his country on April 28,  
4 2007, at the age of 24; and

5           WHEREAS, Assigned to the 1st Battalion, 15th Infantry  
6 Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division,  
7 Sergeant Hicks was one of three soldiers killed when their vehicle  
8 was struck by a roadside bomb and small arms fire during combat  
9 operations in Salman Pak, Iraq; and

10           WHEREAS, Americans owe a profound debt to our nation's  
11 servicemen and servicewomen, whose courageous efforts and enormous  
12 sacrifices are deserving of their fellow citizens' deepest respect  
13 and gratitude; and

14           WHEREAS, Exemplifying the highest ideals of the U.S. armed  
15 forces, Glenn D. Hicks, Jr., inspired others with his fortitude,  
16 tenacity, and courage; although his death leaves a void in the lives  
17 of his loved ones, they will forever carry memories of this heroic  
18 Texan close in their hearts; now, therefore, be it

19           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 80th Texas  
20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Sergeant Glenn D.  
21 Hicks, Jr., and extend deepest sympathy to all those who mourn his  
22 passing; and, be it further
