RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The distinguished historian Dr. Antonia I. 2 Castaneda is beginning a new chapter in her life with her retirement 3 from St. Mary's University in San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, A native of Crystal City, Dr. Castaneda was born into a family of farmworkers and accompanied them as they followed the crops to Washington State when she was a young girl; and

7 WHEREAS, She earned her bachelor's degree in Spanish from 8 Western Washington University and her master's degree in Latin 9 American Studies from the University of Washington; in 1990, she 10 received her Ph.D. in history from Stanford University; and

11 WHEREAS, Professor Castaneda has taught at the University of 12 California, Santa Barbara, and The University of Texas at Austin; 13 in 1997 she joined the history department at St. Mary's University, 14 where she served as the O'Connor Chair from 1998 to 2001; within the 15 history department, Dr. Castaneda has overseen the minor in Mexican 16 American and Latino Studies; and

WHEREAS, One of the most influential Chicana feminist 17 historians in the nation, Dr. Castaneda specializes in the subjects 18 of gender, sexuality, and women of color in California and the 19 Borderlands from the 16th century to the present; in 1972, while 20 21 still a graduate student, she co-edited one of the important works 22 in the field of Chicana and Chicano studies, Literatura Chicana: Texto y Contexto; her recent work encompasses such subjects as the 23 history of Mestizas in colonial Alta California, a bilingual 24

3 WHEREAS, Professor Castaneda has been an inspiring teacher as 4 well as a pioneering scholar, mentoring students and encouraging 5 the development of Chicana and Chicano studies; she has contributed greatly to her profession as a cofounder of Mujeres Activas en 6 Letras y Cambio Social, as the editor of a Chicana studies journal 7 8 and book series for The University of Texas Press, and through her 9 work with the National Association for Chicana and Chicano Studies; in recognition of her work with the NACCS, Dr. Castaneda received a 10 2007 NACCS Scholar Award; and 11

WHEREAS, Both as a teacher and a scholar, Dr. Antonia Castaneda has been one of the most important figures in her discipline; her teaching has inspired her students to continue these important studies, and she may reflect with great pride on all that she has accomplished; now, therefore, be it
