Herald, Jr., Charles Herbert, Forest Henry, Jr., Eddie Orum, Harold Crawford, Horace Williams, and Bruce Goffney and current principal Wiley Johnson; and

WHEREAS, Through the years, many of the school's graduates have had a positive and profound impact in their various fields of endeavor, and the celebration of this landmark anniversary provides an ideal opportunity to pay tribute to the school's graduates and to the dedicated educators who inspired them to achieve their full potential; now, therefore, be it
