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Sec. 418.112. EXCEPTION TO QUORUM REQUIREMENTS. (a) This 1 2 section applies to a local governmental entity created and operating under the laws of this state, including a political 3 4 subdivision, school district, or special district or authority. (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a quorum is not required 5 6 for the governing body of a local governmental entity to act if: 7 (1) the entity's jurisdiction is wholly or partly located in the area of a disaster declared by the president of the 8 United States or the governor; and 9 (2) a majority of the members of the governing body are 10 unable to be present at a meeting of the governing body as a result 11 12 of the disaster. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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17 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
