22	Quality, the Health and Human Services Commission, the Texas
23	Cooperative Extension, councils of governments, an institution of
24	higher education that receives funding from the state for projects

1 <u>that provide assistance to colonias</u>, and any other agency 2 considered appropriate by the secretary of state for purposes of 3 the classification system.

4 (d) The secretary of state shall compile information on
5 colonias that is received from the colonia <u>ombudspersons</u>
6 [<del>ombudsmen</del>] under Section 775.004.

(e) The secretary of state shall:

8 (1) with the assistance of the office of the attorney 9 general, prepare a report on the progress of state-funded projects 10 in providing water or wastewater services, paved roads, and other 11 assistance to colonias; and

14 (A) December 1 of each even-numbered year, if 15 funds are appropriated specifically for the purpose of preparing 16 and submitting the report; or

17 (B) if funds are not appropriated as described by

 19 following that date.
