## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 455, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 455.006 to read as follows: 6
- Sec. 455.006. MOTOR-BUS-ONLY LANE PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The 7 department, in consultation with the Department of Public Safety 8 9 and in conjunction with the appropriate mass transit authorities and the municipalities served by those authorities, shall establish 10 and operate a motor-bus-only lane pilot program for highways in 11
- 12 Bexar, Denton, Travis, and Williamson Counties that are part of the

state highway system and have shoulders of sufficient width and

14 structural integrity.

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- (b) The program shall: 15
- (1) provide for the use by motor buses of highway 16
- shoulders as a low-speed bypass of congested highway lanes when the 17
- 18 speed of vehicles being operated on the main traveled part of the
- adjacent highways is 35 miles per hour or less; 19
- (2) limit the maximum speed of a motor bus being 20
- 21 operated on a motor-bus-only lane to 35 miles per hour;
- (3) gain local operational experience with the 22
- conversion of existing highway shoulders to motor-bus-only lanes 23
- 24 during peak traffic periods; and

- 8 transportation entity described by Section 455.006 that is
- 9 operating on the shoulder of a highway designated as a
- 10 motor-bus-only lane by the Texas Department of Transportation under
- 11 that section is 35 miles per hour.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
