4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 103.051, Civil Practice and Remedies
6	Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection
7	(b-1) to read as follows:
8	(a) To apply for compensation under this subchapter, the
9	claimant must file with the comptroller's judiciary section:
10	(1) an application for compensation provided for that
11	purpose by the comptroller;
12	(2) a verified copy of the pardon or court order
13	justifying the application for compensation; and
14	(3) a statement provided by the Texas Department of
15	Criminal Justice verifying the length of incarceration[; and
16	[(4) a certification of the claimant's actual
17	innocence of the crime for which the claimant was sentenced that is
18	signed by the attorney representing the state in the prosecution of
19	felonies in the county in which the sentence was rendered].
20	(b-1) In determining the eligibility of a claimant, the
21	comptroller shall consider only the verified copy of the pardon or
22	court order filed by the claimant under Subsection (a). If the
23	pardon or court order does not clearly indicate on its face that the
24	pardon or the court order was granted or rendered on the basis of

1	the claimant's actual innocence of the crime for which the claiman
2	was sentenced, the comptroller shall deny the claim. The
3	comptroller's duty to determine the eligibility of a claimant unde
4	this section is purely ministerial.
5	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only

6 to an application for compensation under Section 103.051, Civil 7 Practice and Remedies Code, that is filed on or after the effective 8 date of this Act. An application filed before the effective date of 9 this Act is governed by the law as it existed on the date of filing, 10 and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
