S.B. No. 198

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the recognition of hospitals with outstanding nursing programs and a listing of hospital nursing staff information.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 104, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Sections 104.017 and 104.018 to read as follows:

Sec. 104.017. RECOGNITION OF OUTSTANDING HOSPITAL NURSING PROGRAMS. (a) The statewide health coordinating council shall establish a program to annually recognize hospitals with outstanding nursing programs.

(b) The criteria the council uses in determining whether a hospital's nursing program is eligible for recognition may include a hospital's:

(1) record of attracting and retaining nurses;
(2) implementation of an orientation program for nurses;

(3) implementation of a system to evaluate and address patient, physician, or nurse concerns relating to the quality of nursing practices and care;

(4) demonstration of concern for the health and workplace safety of nurses;

(5) inclusion of a chief nursing officer as a participating member of the hospital's executive team;

3 (7) recognition of individuals who exemplify
4 excellence in nursing; and

5 (8) implementation of policies and procedures adopted
6 to address nursing staff complaints.

7 (c) A copy of the criteria used under Subsection (b) must be
8 made available on the council's Internet website and to a hospital
9 on request.

10 (d) The council shall recognize a hospital with an
11 outstanding nursing program by awarding a certificate and placing
12 the hospital's name on the council's Internet website.

13 Sec. 104.018. LISTING OF HOSPITAL NURSING STAFF
14 INFORMATION. (a) The statewide health coordinating council shall
15 create and maintain on its Internet website a list of the
16 information contained in each report submitted under Subsection
17 (b).

18 (b) A hospital may, but is not required to, annually report
19 to the council the following information for the calendar year
20 preceding the report:

21 (1) the name and location of the hospital;

22 (2) the average, maximum, and minimum number of:

23 (A) registered nurses on the hospital's staff;

24 (B) vocational nurses on the hospital's staff;

25 and

26 (C) advanced practice nurses on the hospital's
27 staff;

1 (3) the nurse-to-patient ratio;

2 (4) the average number of years of nursing experience
3 of the hospital's nursing staff; and

4 (5) other nursing staff information specified by the
5 council.

6 (c) The report must be in the form prescribed by the
7 council.

8 (d) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
9 Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement this
10 section.

11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
