BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 61.9623, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A grant from the professional nursing shortage reduction program to a professional nursing program or other entity involved with a professional nursing program in the preparation of students for initial licensure as registered nurses must be:

 (1) expended exclusively on costs related to:

 (A) enrolling additional students;

(B) nursing faculty enhancement in accordance with Section 61.96231;

1-24 (C) encouraging innovation in the recruitment 1-25 and retention of students, including the recruitment and retention 1-26 of Spanish-speaking and bilingual students; or

1-27 (D) identifying, developing, or implementing 1-28 innovative methods to make the most effective use of limited 1-29 professional nursing program faculty, instructional or clinical 1-30 space, and other resources, including: 1-31 (i) sharing administrative or

1-51 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
