- 4 (d) An eligibility list for a beginning peace officer

  - (h) The grade to be placed on the eligibility list for each examinee shall be computed by adding an examinee's points under Subsection (g), if any, to the examinee's grade on the written examination. Each examinee's grade on the written examination is based on a maximum grade of 100 percent and is determined entirely by the correctness of the examinee's answers to the questions. The minimum passing grade on the examination is 70 percent. An examinee must pass the examination to be placed on an eligibility list.
  - SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an examination administered for a position as a beginning peace officer on or after the effective date of this Act. An examination administered before the effective date of this Act and matters dependent on the examination are governed by the law in effect at the time the examination was administered, and the prior law is continued in effect for this purpose.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
