## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of dentists, dental
- 3 hygienists, dental assistants, and dental laboratories; providing
- 4 penalties.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subsection (a), Section 256.105, Occupations
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Each dentist, dental hygienist, and owner or manager of
- 9 a dental laboratory licensed or registered with the board shall
- 10 timely notify the board of:
- 11 (1) any change of address of the person's place of
- 12 business; [and]
- 13 (2) any change of employers for the dentist or dental
- 14 hygienist and any change of owners or managers for the dental
- 15 laboratory; and
- 16 (3) any change of the person's mailing address.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 257.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- (d) An initial license issued under this subtitle expires on
- 20 the 30th day after the date the license is issued if the holder of
- 21 the license fails to pay the required license fee on or before that
- 22 date.
- SECTION 3. Section 264.151, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:

- Sec. 264.151. CRIMINAL <u>PENALTIES</u> [<u>PENALTY</u>]. (a) A person commits an offense if the person violates <u>Section 256.001</u> [<u>this</u>] subtitle]. An offense under this subsection is a felony of the
- 4 third degree. Each day of a violation is a separate offense.

- 5 (b) A person commits an offense if the person violates
  6 Section 256.052. An offense under this subsection [section] is a
  7 Class A misdemeanor. If it is shown at the trial of an offense under
  8 this subsection that the defendant was previously convicted of an
  9 offense for a violation of Section 256.052, the offense is a felony
- 11 (c) A person commits an offense if the person violates
  12 Subchapter D, Chapter 262. An offense under this subsection is a
  13 Class A misdemeanor. Each day of a violation is a separate offense
  14 [A violation under this section does not include a violation to
  15 which Section 262.203 applies].
  - dental hygienist and violates an injunction or cease and desist order issued under Subchapter B. An offense under this subsection is a Class A misdemeanor. If it is shown at the trial of an offense under this subsection [section] that the defendant was previously convicted of an offense for a violation of an injunction or cease and desist order issued under Subchapter B [under this section or if the offense involves practicing without an appropriate board license], the offense is a felony of the third degree.
- $\left[\frac{(e)}{e}\right]$  Each day of a violation is a separate offense.
- SECTION 4. Section 265.005, Occupations Code, is amended by

- adding Subsections (m), (n), and (o) to read as follows:
- 2 (m) A dental assistant who holds a certificate of
- 3 registration issued under this section shall display the person's
- 4 current certificate of registration in each office in which the
- 5 person makes dental x-rays. If the person makes dental x-rays at
- 6 more than one location, the person may display a duplicate of the
- 7 original registration certificate obtained from the board on
- 8 payment of a duplicate certificate fee set by the board.
- 9 <u>(n) A dental assistant who holds a certificate of</u>
- 10 registration issued under this section shall timely notify the
- 11 board of:
- 12 (1) any change of address of the person's place of
- 13 <u>business;</u>
- 14 <u>(2) any change of employers; and</u>
- 15 (3) any change of the person's mailing address.
- 16 (o) An initial certificate of registration issued under
- 17 this section expires on the 30th day after the date the certificate
- is issued if the holder of the certificate fails to pay the required
- 19 certificate fee on or before that date.
- 20 SECTION 5. Subsection (a), Section 266.101, Occupations
- 21 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The council shall review each application for
- 23 registration or renewal of registration to determine if the
- 24 applicant meets the requirements of this chapter. [The council
- 25 shall provide to the board a list of applicants eligible for
- 26 registration.
- 27 SECTION 6. Subchapter D, Chapter 266, Occupations Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 266.155 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 266.155. INITIAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE FEE. An
- 3 initial registration certificate issued under this subchapter
- 4 expires on the 30th day after the date the registration certificate
- 5 <u>is issued if the holder of the registration certificate fails to pay</u>
- 6 the required registration certificate fee on or before that date.
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 266.303, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 8 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read
- 9 as follows:
- 10 (c) An offense for a violation of Section 266.301(c) [or
- 11  $\frac{\text{(d)}}{\text{]}}$  is a Class C misdemeanor. If it is shown on the trial of an
- 12 offense under this section that the defendant has previously been
- 13 convicted for an offense for a violation of Section 266.301(c)
- 14 [under this subsection], the offense is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 15 (d) An offense for a violation of Section 266.301(d) is a
- 16 Class B misdemeanor. If it is shown on the trial of an offense under
- 17 this section that the defendant has previously been convicted of an
- offense for a violation of Section 266.301(d), the offense is a
- 19 Class A misdemeanor.
- (e) Each day of a violation is a separate offense.
- 21 SECTION 8. Section 262.203, Occupations Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 9. (a) The changes in law made by this Act by the
- 23 repeal of Section 262.203, Occupations Code, and the amendment of
- 24 Sections 264.151 and 266.303, Occupations Code, apply only to an
- offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For
- 26 purposes of this section, an offense is committed before the
- 27 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs

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- before that date.
- 2 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 3 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 4 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 10. The changes in law made by this Act by the
- 6 enactment of Subsection (d), Section 257.001, Subsection (o),
- 7 Section 265.005, and Section 266.155, Occupations Code, apply only
- 8 to a license, certificate of registration, or registration
- 9 certificate initially issued on or after the effective date of this
- 10 Act. A license, certificate of registration, or registration
- 11 certificate initially issued before the effective date of this Act
- 12 is governed by the law in effect on the date the license,
- 13 certificate of registration, or registration certificate is
- issued, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
