- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subsection (b), Section 502.407, Transportation
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A justice of the peace or municipal court judge having
- 8 jurisdiction of the offense may:
- 9 (1) dismiss a charge of driving with an expired motor
- 10 vehicle registration if the defendant:
- 11 (A) remedies the defect not later than the 20th
- 12 [10th] working day after the date of the offense or before the
- 13 defendant's first court appearance date, whichever is later; and
- 14 (B) establishes that the fee prescribed by
- 15 Section 502.176 has been paid; and
- 16 (2) assess an administrative fee not to exceed \$20
- 17 [\$10] when the charge is dismissed.
- SECTION 2. Section 521.026, Transportation Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- Sec. 521.026. DISMISSAL OF EXPIRED LICENSE CHARGE. (a) A
- 21 judge may dismiss a charge of driving with an expired license if the
- 22 defendant remedies this defect within 20 [10] working days or
- 23 before the defendant's first court appearance date, whichever is
- 24 later.

- 1 (b) The judge may assess the defendant an administrative fee

- 4 SECTION 3. Subsection (b), Section 548.605, Transportation
- 5 Code, is amended to read as follows:

- 7 (1) dismiss a charge of driving with an expired
- 8 inspection certificate if:
- 9 (A) the defendant remedies the defect within 20
- 10 [10] working days or before the defendant's first court appearance
- 11 date, whichever is later; and
- 12 (B) the inspection certificate has not been
- 13 expired for more than 60 days; and
- 14 (2) assess an administrative fee not to exceed \$20
- 15 [\$10] when the charge of driving with an expired inspection
- 16 certificate has been remedied.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
