17	Sec. 9014.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a water
18	control and improvement district in Kaufman County created under
19	and essential to accomplish the purposes of Section 59, Article
20	XVI, Texas Constitution.
21	Sec. 9014.003. CONFIRMATION ELECTION REQUIRED. If the
22	creation of the district is not confirmed at a confirmation
23	election held under Section 9014.024 before September 1, 2011:
24	(1) the district is dissolved September 1, 2011,

1	<pre>except that the district shall:</pre>			
2	(A) pay any debts incurred;			
3	(B) transfer to Kaufman County any assets that			
4	remain after the payment of debts; and			
5	(C) maintain the organization of the district			
6	until all debts are paid and remaining assets are transferred; and			
7	(2) this chapter expires September 1, 2014.			
8	Sec. 9014.004. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The			
9	district is initially composed of the territory described by			
10	Section 2 of the Act creating this chapter.			
11	(b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of			
12	the Act creating this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the			
13	field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process			
14	<pre>does not affect:</pre>			
15	(1) the organization, existence, or validity of the			
16	district;			
17	(2) the right of the district to impose taxes;			
18	(3) the validity of the district's bonds, notes, or			
19	indebtedness; or			
20	(4) the legality or operation of the district or the			
21	board.

23	SUBCHAPTER A-1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONS			
24	Sec. 9014.021. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after

27	requesting that the commission appoint as temporary directors the

- 2 (b) The commission shall appoint as temporary directors the
- 3 five persons named in the first petition received by the commission
- 4 under Subsection (a).

- 16 agreeable to a majority of the directors. If a location cannot be
- 17 agreed upon, the directors shall meet at the Kaufman County
- 18 Courthouse. At the meeting, the temporary directors shall elect
- 19 officers from among the temporary directors and conduct any other
- 20 district business.
- Sec. 9014.023. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The
- temporary directors may not hold an election under Section 9014.024
- 23 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or
- 24 <u>extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has adopted a</u>
- 25 resolution consenting to the creation of the district.
- Sec. 9014.024. CONFIRMATION AND INITIAL DIRECTORS'
- 27 ELECTION. The temporary directors shall hold an election to

- 1 confirm the creation of the district and to elect five directors as
- 2 provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.
- 3 Sec. 9014.025. INITIAL ELECTED DIRECTORS; TERMS. The
- 4 directors elected under Section 9014.024 shall draw lots to
- 5 determine which two shall serve until the first regularly scheduled
- 6 election of directors and which three shall serve until the second
- 7 regularly scheduled election of directors.
- 8 Sec. 9014.026. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
- 9 expires September 1, 2014.
- 10 [Sections 9014.027-9014.050 reserved for expansion]
- SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
- Sec. 9014.051. DIRECTORS; TERMS. (a) The district is
- 13 governed by a board of five directors.
- 14 (b) Directors serve staggered four-year terms.
- 15 [Sections 9014.052-9014.100 reserved for expansion]
- SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES
- 17 Sec. 9014.101. WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT
- 18 POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided
- by the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 51,
- 20 Water Code, applicable to water control and improvement districts
- 21 created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.
- 22 Sec. 9014.102. ROAD PROJECTS. (a) To the extent
- 23 authorized by Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the
- 24 district may construct, acquire, improve, maintain, or operate
- 25 macadamized, graveled, or paved roads or turnpikes, or improvements
- 26 <u>in aid of those roads or turnpikes, inside the district.</u>
- 27 (b) A road project must meet all applicable construction

- 1 standards, zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulatory
- 2 ordinances or orders of:
- 3 (1) each municipality in whose corporate limits or
- 4 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located; and
- 5 (2) each county in which the district is located.
- 6 (c) The district may not undertake a road project unless:
- 7 (1) each municipality in whose corporate limits or
- 8 <u>extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located consents by</u>
- 9 <u>ordinance or resolution; and</u>
- 10 (2) each county in which the district is located
- 11 consents by order or resolution.
- Sec. 9014.103. DIVISION OF DISTRICT. (a) The district may
- 13 be divided into two new districts only if the district:
- 14 (1) has no outstanding bonded debt; and
- 15 (2) is not imposing ad valorem taxes.
- 16 (b) The division procedure is prescribed by Sections 53.030
- through 53.041, Water Code. Sections 51.748 through 51.753, Water
- 18 Code, do not apply to the district.
- 19 (c) Any new district created by the division of the district
- 20 has all the powers and duties of the district.
- 21 (d) Any new district created by the division of the district
- 22 may not, at the time the new district is created, contain any land
- 23 outside the area described by Section 2 of the Act creating this
- 24 chapter.

- December 31, 2017, the district may not be dissolved unless the

13	Sec. 9014.201. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER		
14	OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may issue bonds or other		
15	obligations as provided by Chapters 49 and 51, Water Code, to		
16	finance the construction, maintenance, or operation of a project		
17	under Section 9014.101 or 9014.102.		
18	(b) The district may not issue bonds or other obligations to		
19	finance projects authorized by Section 9014.102 unless the issuance		
20	is approved by a vote of a two-thirds majority of the district		
21	voters voting at an election called for that purpose.		
22	(c) Bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance		
23	projects authorized by Section 9014.102 may not exceed one-fourth		
24	of the assessed value of the real property in the district.
