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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 95, Health and Safety
 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 95. RISK ASSESSMENT FOR TYPE 2 DIABETES [ACANTHOSIS
- 9 NIGRICANS SCREENING]
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 95.001, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Subdivisions (1-a) and (1-b) and amending
- 12 Subdivision (3) to read as follows:
- 13 (1-a) "Advisory committee" means the Type 2 Diabetes
- 14 Risk Assessment Program Advisory Committee established under
- 15 Section 95.006.
- 16 (1-b) "Council" means the Texas Diabetes Council.
- 17 (3) "Office" means [the Texas-Mexico Border Health
- 18 Coordination Office of The University of Texas-Pan American Border
- 19 <u>Health Office</u>.
- 20 SECTION 3. Sections 95.002, 95.003, and 95.004, Health and
- 21 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 Sec. 95.002. TYPE 2 DIABETES [ACANTHOSIS NIGRICANS]
- 23 EDUCATION AND RISK ASSESSMENT PROGRAM [SCREENING PROJECT].
- 24 (a) The office shall administer a risk assessment program for Type

- 1 <u>2 diabetes</u> [an acanthosis nigricans screening program] in 2 accordance with this chapter.
- 3 (b) The office, after reviewing recommendations made by the
 4 advisory committee, [executive council] by rule shall coordinate
 5 the risk assessment for Type 2 diabetes [screening] of individuals
 6 who attend public or private schools located in Texas Education
 7 Agency Regional Education Service Centers 1, 2, 3, 4, 10, 11, 13,
 8 15, 18, 19, and 20 and, by using existing funding as efficiently as
 9 possible or by using other available funding, in additional
- 11 (c) The rules must include procedures necessary to
 12 administer the risk assessment program, including procedures that
 13 require each school to record and report risk assessment
 14 [screening] activities using:
- 15 <u>(1) an existing database used to administer and track</u> 16 risk assessment data; or
- 17 (2) widely accepted surveillance software selected by
 18 the office.
- 19 (d) The office shall require <u>a risk assessment for Type 2</u>
 20 <u>diabetes</u> [acanthosis nigricans screening] to be performed at the
 21 same time hearing and vision screening is performed under Chapter
 22 36 or spinal screening is performed under Chapter 37. <u>The risk</u>
 23 assessment for Type 2 diabetes should:
- 24 (1) identify students with acanthosis nigricans; and
- 25 <u>(2) further assess students identified under</u>
- 26 <u>Subdivision (1) to determine the students':</u>

regional education service centers.

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27 (A) body mass index; and

1	(B) blood pressure.
2	(e) The office may:
3	(1) coordinate the risk assessment for Type 2 diabetes
4	[acanthosis nigricans screening] activities of school districts,
5	private schools, state agencies, volunteer organizations,
6	universities, and other entities so that the efforts of each entity
7	are complementary and not fragmented and duplicative; and
8	(2) [. The office may] provide technical assistance
9	to those entities in developing <u>risk assessment</u> [screening]
10	programs.
11	(f) The office shall:
12	(1) [and may] provide educational and other material
13	to assist local <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] activities;
14	(2) [. (f) The office shall] monitor the quality of
15	risk assessment [screening] activities provided under this
16	chapter; and
17	(3) consult with the Board of Nurse Examiners to
18	determine the training requirements necessary for a nurse or other
19	person to conduct risk assessment activities under this chapter.
20	(g) The office shall provide on the office's Internet
21	website information on obesity, Type 2 diabetes, and related
22	conditions to health care providers and update the information at
23	<pre>least annually.</pre>
24	Sec. 95.003. COMPLIANCE WITH RISK ASSESSMENT [SCREENING]
25	REQUIREMENTS. (a) Each individual required by rules adopted under
26	this chapter to be <u>assessed</u> [screened] shall undergo approved <u>risk</u>
27	assessment [screening] for Type 2 diabetes [acanthosis nigricans].

- 1 The individual shall comply with the requirements as soon as
- 2 possible after the individual's admission to a school and as
- 3 required by rule. The individual or, if the individual is a minor,
- 4 the minor's parent, managing conservator, or quardian may
- 5 substitute a professional examination for the risk assessment
- 6 [screening].
- 7 (b) An individual is exempt from <u>risk assessment</u>
- 8 [$\frac{\text{screening}}{\text{screening}}$] if $\frac{\text{risk assessment}}{\text{screening}}$] conflicts with the
- 9 tenets and practices of a recognized church or religious
- 10 denomination of which the individual is an adherent or a member. To
- 11 qualify for the exemption, the individual or, if the individual is a
- 12 minor, the individual's parent, managing conservator, or guardian
- 13 must submit to the chief administrator of the school on or before
- 14 the day of the <u>risk assessment process</u> [screening procedure] an
- 15 affidavit stating the objections to the risk assessment
- 16 [screening].
- 17 (c) The chief administrator of each school shall ensure that
- 18 each individual admitted to the school complies with the risk
- 19 assessment [screening] requirements set by the office [executive
- 20 council or submits an affidavit of exemption.
- Sec. 95.004. RECORDS; REPORTS. (a) The chief
- 22 administrator of each school shall maintain, on a form prescribed
- 23 by the office, risk assessment [executive council, screening]
- 24 records for each individual in attendance $[\tau]$ and enter the risk
- 25 <u>assessment information for each individual on the surveillance</u>
- 26 <u>software selected by the office. The risk assessment</u> [the] records
- 27 are open for inspection by the office or the local health

- 1 department.
- 2 (b) The office may, directly or through local health
- 3 departments, enter a school and inspect records maintained by the
- 4 school relating to risk assessment [screening] for Type 2 diabetes
- 5 [acanthosis nigricans].
- 6 (c) An individual's risk assessment [screening] records may
- 7 be transferred among schools without the consent of the individual
- 8 or, if the individual is a minor, the minor's parent, managing
- 9 conservator, or guardian.
- 10 (d) The person performing the risk assessment [screening]
- 11 shall send a report indicating that an individual may be at risk for
- 12 developing Type 2 diabetes [have acanthosis nigricans] to the
- 13 individual or, if the individual is a minor, the minor's parent,
- 14 managing conservator, or guardian. The report must include:
- 15 (1) an explanation of:
- 16 (A) the process for assessing risk for developing
- 17 Type 2 diabetes;
- 18 (B) the reasons the individual was identified in
- 19 the risk assessment process as being at risk for developing Type 2
- 20 diabetes;
- 21 (C) the risk factors associated with developing
- 22 Type 2 diabetes; and
- 23 (D) the individual's body mass index [acanthosis
- 24 <u>nigricans and related conditions</u>];
- 25 (2) a statement concerning an individual's or family's
- 26 need for further evaluation for Type 2 diabetes and related [of]
- 27 conditions [related to acanthosis nigricans]; [and]

- 1 (3) instructions to help the individual or family
- 2 receive evaluation by a physician or other health care provider;
- 3 and
- 4 (4) information on procedures for applying for the
- 5 state child health plan program and the state Medicaid program [and
- 6 intervention by the school district].
- 7 (e) Each school shall submit to the office an annual report
- 8 on the <u>risk assessment</u> [screening] status of the individuals in
- 9 attendance during the reporting year and shall include in the
- 10 report any other information required by the office.
- 11 <u>(f)</u> The report <u>required under Subsection (e)</u> must:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> be compiled from the information entered into the
- 13 <u>surveillance software;</u>
- 14 (2) be on a form prescribed by the office; [executive
- 15 council and
- 16 <u>(3)</u> [must] be submitted according to the <u>timetable</u>
- 17 <u>established by the office's</u> [<u>executive council's</u>] rules.
- 18 (g) After the end of the reporting period under Subsection
- 19 (e), the office shall:
- 20 (1) analyze and compile a summary of the reports
- 21 submitted by schools during that reporting period;
- 22 (2) file a copy of the summary with the advisory
- 23 committee; and
- 24 (3) post on an Internet website accessible to each
- 25 school required to submit a report under Subsection (e):
- 26 (A) the number of students and the percentage of
- 27 the student population identified by each of those schools during

- 1 the reporting period as at risk for Type 2 diabetes; and
- 2 (B) comparison data and analyses regarding the
- 3 information required to be reported under that subsection.
- 4 (h) The office shall deliver to the chief administrator of
- 5 <u>each school and the school nurse or other person responsible for</u>
- 6 conducting risk assessment activities for the school under this
- 7 <u>chapter an annual summary compilation of the reports subm</u>itted by
- 8 schools under Subsection (e).
- 9 (i) $[\frac{f}{f}]$ Not later than January 15 of each odd-numbered
- 10 year, the office shall submit to the governor and the legislature a
- 11 report relating to [concerning] the implementation and
- 12 effectiveness of the Type 2 diabetes risk assessment [acanthosis
- 13 nigricans screening] program established by this chapter that
- 14 includes a detailed description of the expenses related to the
- 15 program.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 95, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- adding Sections 95.005 and 95.006 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 95.005. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The office may accept gifts,
- 19 grants, and donations to support the Type 2 diabetes risk
- 20 assessment program conducted under this chapter.
- Sec. 95.006. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The Type 2 Diabetes
- 22 Risk Assessment Program Advisory Committee is established to advise
- 23 the office on the Type 2 diabetes risk assessment program conducted
- 24 <u>under this chapter.</u>
- 25 (b) The advisory committee is composed of:
- 26 (1) the following representatives appointed by the
- 27 executive director of the office:

2	<u>(B</u>) one representative of the Texas Education
3	Agency;	
4	<u>(C</u>) one representative of the Texas Pediatric
5	Society;	
6	<u>(D</u>) one representative of the American Diabetes
7	Association;	
8	<u>(E</u>) one representative who is a member of the
9	board of regents of	The University of Texas-Pan American;
10	<u>(F</u>) one school nurse representative from an urban
11	school located wit	thin the boundaries of a regional education
12	service center;	
13	<u>(G</u>	one parent or guardian of a child who resides
14	within the boundari	es of a regional education service center; and
15	<u>(H</u>	one person with knowledge and experience in
16	health care in school	ol settings; and
17	<u>(2)</u> th	e following representatives appointed by the
18	chairman of the cour	ncil:
19	<u>(A</u>	one representative of the council;
20	<u>(B</u>) one representative of the Texas Medical
21	Association;	
22	<u>(C</u>) one school district administrator
23	representative from	n a school district located within the boundaries
24	of a regional educat	tion service center;
25	<u>(D</u>) one school principal representative from a
26	school district l	ocated within the boundaries of a regional
27	education service c	enter; and

- 1 (E) one school nurse representative from a rural
- 2 school located within the boundaries of a regional education
- 3 service center.
- 4 (c) A person may not be a member of the advisory committee if
- 5 the person is required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305,
- 6 Government Code, because of the person's activities for
- 7 compensation on behalf of a health care profession or related
- 8 <u>business or another profession related to the operation of the</u>
- 9 council.
- 10 (d) The representative of the office appointed under
- 11 Subsection (b)(1)(A) shall serve as the presiding officer of the
- 12 <u>advisory committee.</u>
- 13 (e) The advisory committee shall meet at least twice a year
- 14 and at other times at the call of the presiding officer. The
- 15 advisory committee may meet by teleconference if an in-person
- 16 meeting of all the members is not practicable.
- 17 (f) Members of the advisory committee may not receive
- 18 compensation for service on the committee. An advisory committee
- 19 member is entitled to reimbursement of travel expenses incurred by
- the member while conducting the business of the advisory committee
- 21 to the extent that funds are available to the office for that
- 22 purpose.
- 23 (g) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 24 size, composition, or duration of the advisory committee.
- 25 (h) The advisory committee shall:
- 26 (1) recommend the person who should be responsible for
- 27 conducting risk assessment activities under this chapter for

- 1 schools that do not employ a school nurse;
- 2 (2) advise the office on the age groups that would
- 3 benefit most from the risk assessment activities under this
- 4 <u>chapter;</u>
- 5 (3) recommend a method to record and report the number
- 6 of children who are identified in the risk assessment process as
- 7 being at risk for having or developing Type 2 diabetes and who
- 8 qualify for the national free or reduced-price lunch program
- 9 established under 42 U.S.C. Section 1751 et seq.;
- 10 (4) recommend a deadline, which may not be later than
- 11 the first anniversary of the date the advisory committee submits a
- 12 recommendation to the office under this section, by which the
- office shall implement the advisory committee's recommended risk
- 14 assessment activities, surveillance methods, reports, and quality
- 15 improvements;
- 16 (5) contribute to the state plan for diabetes
- 17 treatment developed by the council under Section 103.013 by
- 18 providing statistics and information on the risk assessment
- 19 activities conducted under this chapter and recommendations for
- 20 assisting children in this state at risk for developing Type 2
- 21 diabetes; and
- 22 <u>(6) recommend any additional information to be</u>
- included in the report required by Section 95.004.
- 24 (i) The advisory committee shall submit to the office a
- 25 report of the recommendations developed under Subsection (h) not
- later than September 1 of each even-numbered year. The office,
- 27 subject to the availability of funds, shall implement each advisory

- 1 committee recommendation concerning the Type 2 diabetes risk
- 2 assessment program.
- 3 (j) In this section, "regional education service center"
- 4 means a Texas Education Agency Regional Education Service Center
- 5 <u>listed in Section 95.002(b).</u>
- 6 SECTION 5. Subsection (h), Section 110.15, Education Code,
- 7 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (h) In conducting its activities under this section, the
- 9 center shall consult with [the Texas-Mexico Border Health
- 10 Coordination Office of The University of Texas-Pan American Border
- 11 <u>Health Office</u> that administers <u>the Type 2 Diabetes risk assessment</u>
- 12 [an acanthosis nigricans screening] program under Chapter 95,
- 13 Health and Safety Code.
- SECTION 6. Subdivisions (2) and (6), Section 95.001, Health
- 15 and Safety Code, are repealed.
- SECTION 7. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 17 date of this Act, the executive director of The University of
- 18 Texas--Pan American Border Health Office shall appoint eight of the
- 19 initial members of the Type 2 Diabetes Risk Assessment Program
- 20 Advisory Committee in accordance with Subdivision (1), Subsection
- 21 (b), Section 95.006, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 23 Act, the chairman of the Texas Diabetes Council shall appoint five
- 24 of the initial members of the Type 2 Diabetes Risk Assessment
- 25 Program Advisory Committee in accordance with Subdivision (2),
- 26 Subsection (b), Section 95.006, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 27 this Act.

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1 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
