- 4 SECTION 1. Section 9.014, Family Code, is amended to read as

- 6 Sec. 9.014. ATTORNEY'S FEES. The court may award
- 7 reasonable attorney's fees [as costs] in a proceeding under this
- 8 subchapter. The court may order the attorney's fees to be paid
- 9 directly to the attorney, who may enforce the order for fees in the
- 10 attorney's own name by any means available for the enforcement of a
- 11 judgment for debt.
- 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 9, Family Code, is amended
- 13 by adding Section 9.106 to read as follows:
- Sec. 9.106. ATTORNEY'S FEES. In a proceeding under this
- subchapter, the court may award reasonable attorney's fees incurred
- by a party to a divorce or annulment against the other party to the
- 17 divorce or annulment. The court may order the attorney's fees to be
- 18 paid directly to the attorney, who may enforce the order for fees in
- 19 the attorney's own name by any means available for the enforcement
- 20 of a judgment for debt.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 9.205, Family Code, is amended to read as
- 22 follows:
- Sec. 9.205. ATTORNEY'S FEES. In a proceeding to divide
- 24 property previously undivided in a decree of divorce or annulment

- 1 as provided by this subchapter, the court may award reasonable
- 2 attorney's fees [as costs]. The court may order the attorney's fees
- 3 to be paid directly to the attorney, who may enforce the order in
- 4 the attorney's own name by any means available for the enforcement
- 5 of a judgment for debt.
- 6 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 7 a proceeding commenced under Chapter 9, Family Code, on or after the
- 8 effective date of this Act. A proceeding commenced under Chapter 9,
- 9 Family Code, before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 10 the law in effect immediately before that date, and the former law
- is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
