12	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 9, Family Code, is amended
13	by adding Section 9.106 to read as follows:
14	Sec. 9.106. ATTORNEY'S FEES. The court may award
15	reasonable attorney's fees in a proceeding under this subchapter.
16	The court may order the attorney's fees to be paid directly to the
17	attorney, who may enforce the order for fees in the attorney's own
18	name by any means available for the enforcement of a judgment for
19	debt.
20	SECTION 3. Section 9.205, Family Code, is amended to read as
21	follows:
22	Sec. 9.205. ATTORNEY'S FEES. In a proceeding to divide
23	property previously undivided in a decree of divorce or annulment
24	as provided by this subchapter, the court may award reasonable

attorney's fees [as costs]. The court may order the attorney's fees to be paid directly to the attorney, who may enforce the order in the attorney's own name by any means available for the enforcement of a judgment for debt.

5 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 6 a proceeding commenced under Chapter 9, Family Code, on or after the 7 effective date of this Act. A proceeding commenced under Chapter 9, 8 Family Code, before the effective date of this Act is governed by 9 the law in effect immediately before that date, and the former law 10 is continued in effect for that purpose.
