## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to waivers for certain counties and municipalities from

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Article 103.0033, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
6	amended by adding Subsections $(h-1)$ , $(h-2)$ , and $(h-3)$ to read as
7	follows:
8	(h-1) The office shall grant a waiver under Subsection (h)
9	if the office determines an existing collection plan or process of
10	the county or municipality requesting the waiver is resulting in a
11	collection rate comparable to the average collection rate in
12	counties or municipalities, as applicable, that have implemented
13	programs.
14	(h-2) When computing the collection rate of an existing
15	collection plan or process under Subsection (h-1), the office may
16	not consider court costs, fees, or fines owed by persons who are
17	confined in a correctional or detention facility if a significant
18	portion of the total amount of court costs, fees, and fines owed to
19	the county or municipality, as determined by the office, are owed by
20	those persons.
21	(h-3) The office shall adopt:
22	(1) guidelines that provide counties and
23	municipalities flexibility in complying with the requirements of
24	the model developed by the office; and

- 1 (2) guidelines regarding the circumstances under
  2 which the office will grant a waiver under Subsection (h),
  3 including guidelines on how the office determines the
  4 cost-effectiveness of implementing a program in a county or
  5 municipality.
- SECTION 2. As soon as practicable, the Office of Court
  Administration of the Texas Judicial System shall adopt the
  guidelines required by Article 103.0033(h-3), Code of Criminal
  Procedure, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
