A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a dual language education pilot project in certain
- 3 school districts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) This Act may be cited as the "21st Century 6 Texas Educational Competitiveness Act."
- 7 In the 2002-2003 school year, over 50 percent of the students enrolled in the first grade in the three largest school 8 districts in this state, the Houston, Dallas, and Fort Worth 9 Independent School Districts, were Hispanic. Forty percent of 10 those students were classified as students of limited English 11 The data for those school districts represent a 12 proficiency. 13 growing statewide trend that will pose significant challenges to 14 educators of children who are required to learn in a language other 15 than the primary language spoken in the home. Dual language education programs provide instruction in both English and the 16 native language of the non-English-speaking students. 17 promote bilingualism, biliteracy, and 18 programs grade-level academic achievement by placing both native English-speaking and 19 non-English-speaking students together in one classroom. 20 Thomas and Virginia Collier conducted a study in which they 21 22 examined the records of 700,000 students in various bilingual 23 education programs. The study found that those students who received grade-level cognitive and academic instruction in both 24

- 1 their first and second languages for many years were succeeding at
- 2 the end of high school. In fact, by the eighth grade, nonnative
- 3 English speakers in dual language education programs were found to
- 4 outperform native English speakers on standardized tests. Those
- 5 programs also experience lower dropout rates than other bilingual
- 6 education programs. The 21st Century Texas Educational
- 7 Competitiveness Act establishes a pilot program to study the
- 8 effectiveness of dual language education.
- 9 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 21.0485 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 21.0485. DUAL LANGUAGE EDUCATION TEACHER
- 12 CERTIFICATION. (a) To ensure that there are teachers with special
- 13 training to work with other teachers and with students in a dual
- 14 language education program, the board shall establish a dual
- 15 language education teaching certificate.
- 16 (b) The board shall propose rules establishing the training
- 17 requirements, including the minimum academic qualifications, a
- 18 person must accomplish to obtain a certificate under this section.
- 19 (c) The board shall propose rules establishing the
- 20 requirements for a teacher who receives training in a foreign
- 21 country to obtain a certificate under this section.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 28.0052 to read as follows:
- Sec. 28.0052. DUAL LANGUAGE EDUCATION PILOT PROJECT.
- 25 (a) The commissioner shall establish a pilot project in school
- 26 districts selected by the commissioner under which the agency
- 27 examines dual language education programs and the effect of those

3 commissioner shall: 4 (1) select districts that will commit to operate a 5 dual language education program: 6 (A) for at least three years; and 7 (B) on one or more district campuses selected by the commissioner that demonstrate a substantially equal enrollment 8 of students with limited English proficiency and students whose 9 primary language is English or, if a district does not have a campus 10 with a sufficient number of limited English proficiency students to 11 meet the equal enrollment standard, on one or more district 12 campuses selected by the commissioner that will include the 13 enrollment of students with limited English proficiency, students 14 15 whose primary language is English, and bilingual students; and 16 (2) give preference to a district that: 17 (A) demonstrates the potential for expanding the

programs on a student's ability to graduate from high school.

(b) In selecting school districts under Subsection (a), the

program through middle school; and

kindergarten level.

- 23 (d) The commissioner by rule shall require a district to
 24 limit activities of the dual language education program during the
 25 first year of the program to planning activities, including:
- 26 <u>(1) hiring and training teachers and ensuring teacher</u> 27 <u>certification;</u>

1	(2) establishing parental and community support for
2	the program; and
3	(3) acquiring adequate learning materials in both
4	program languages.
5	(e) A program that applies for the expansion of an existing
6	dual language education program is eligible for funding under the
7	pilot project only to the extent authorized by the commissioner in
8	<pre>compliance with Subsection (c).</pre>
9	(f) Funding provided for a dual language education program
10	<pre>may be used by a district for:</pre>
11	(1) classroom materials; and
12	(2) tuition and textbook expenses for students seeking
13	teacher certification under Section 21.0485.
14	(g) The agency shall report to the legislature describing
15	the agency's activities under the pilot project, the effect of the
16	project on grade-level completion and high school graduation rates,
17	and the recommendations arising from the project. The agency shall
18	submit an interim report under this subsection not later than
19	January 1, 2011, and a final report not later than January 1, 2013.
20	(h) This section expires August 1, 2013.
21	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
22	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
23	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
