A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the requirement that licensed physicians provide
3 emergency contact information to the Texas Medical Board.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 156, Occupations Code, is
6 amended by adding Section 156.006 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 156.006. EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION. (a) Each
8 license holder shall submit to the board telephone numbers, fax
9 numbers, and e-mail addresses, if available and as appropriate,
10 that the board may use to contact the license holder in an
11 emergency.

12 (b) A license holder who receives an initial registration
13 permit shall provide the information required under Subsection (a)
14 not later than the 30th day after the date the permit is issued.
15 Each license holder who applies to renew a registration permit
16 shall submit the information required under Subsection (a) with the
17 renewal application.

18 (c) A license holder shall report to the board any change in
19 the information required under Subsection (a) not later than the
20 45th day after the date of the change.

21 (d) The information provided by a license holder under this
22 section is confidential and is not subject to disclosure under
23 Chapter 552, Government Code. The board may not publish, release,
24 or make available information provided by a license holder under

1 this section except as provided by Subsection (e).

2 (e) In the event of a public health emergency declared or
3 invoked by the governor, the Department of State Health Services,
4 or a federal agency, the board may publish, release, or make
5 available information provided by a license holder under this
6 section for the sole purpose of disseminating information to:

7 (1) a license holder;

8 (2) a designated city, county, state, or federal
9 public health or emergency management official; or

10 (3) the Federation of State Medical Boards.

11 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2007, each person
12 who holds a license to practice medicine under Chapter 155,
13 Occupations Code, shall submit to the Texas Medical Board telephone
14 numbers, fax numbers, and e-mail addresses, if available and as
15 appropriate, that the board may use to contact the license holder in
16 an emergency.

17 (b) The information provided by a license holder under this
18 section is confidential and is not subject to disclosure under
19 Chapter 552, Government Code. The Texas Medical Board may not
20 publish, release, or make available information provided by a
21 license holder under this section except as provided by this
22 subsection.

23 (c) This section expires September 1, 2008.

24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
