Information that is confidential 20 21 and exempted from disclosure under this subsection includes an appraisal, completed report, evaluation, <u>or</u> investigation 22 23 conducted for the purpose of locating or determining the purchase

or sale price of the property, or any report prepared in

1 anticipation of <u>developing</u>, purchasing, or selling real property.

2 (b) Information that is confidential and excluded from 3 disclosure under Subsection (a) is not subject to a subpoena 4 directed to the School Land Board, Veterans' Land Board, land 5 office, commissioner, attorney general, or governor.

6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
