A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to providing medical assistance to certain former foster
 3 care adolescents.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- is amended by adding Section 32.02471 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.02471. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR CERTAIN FORMER FOSTER
- 8 CARE ADOLESCENTS ENROLLED IN HIGHER EDUCATION. (a) In this
- 9 section, "independent foster care adolescent" has the meaning
- 10 assigned by Section 32.0247.
- 11 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (d), the department
- 12 shall provide medical assistance to a person who:
- 13 (1) is 21 years of age or older but younger than 25
- 14 years of age;

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- 15 (2) would be eligible to receive assistance as an
- 16 independent foster care adolescent under Section 32.0247 if the
- person were younger than 21 years of age; and
- 18 (3) is enrolled in an institution of higher education,
- 19 as defined by Section 61.003(8), Education Code, or a private or
- 20 independent institution of higher education, as defined by Section
- 21 61.003(15), Education Code, that is located in this state and is
- 22 making satisfactory academic progress as determined by the
- 23 institution.
- (c) The department shall apply for and actively pursue a

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- 1 waiver or other authorization from an appropriate federal agency to
- 2 receive matching funds to provide medical assistance under this
- 3 section.
- 4 (d) If the waiver or authorization applied for under
- 5 Subsection (c) is not granted, the department shall use funds
- 6 appropriated for that purpose to develop and implement a program
- 7 designed to provide health care services and benefits to a person
- 8 described by Subsection (b) in a manner that is substantively
- 9 <u>identical to the medical assistance provided to independent foster</u>
- 10 care adolescents under Section 32.0247, except to the extent that
- 11 programmatic differences are appropriate because of the
- 12 populations served by the programs and the sources of funding for
- the programs.
- SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2007, the Health and
- 15 Human Services Commission shall apply to the federal Centers for
- 16 Medicare and Medicaid Services for a waiver or other authorization
- 17 as required by Section 32.02471, Human Resources Code, as added by
- 18 this Act.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
