A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the regulation of funeral homes, cemeteries, and
- 3 crematories.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 711.004, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subsection (m) to read as follows:
- 7 (m) If a removal of remains is made to correct an error by a
- 8 cemetery organization, the cemetery organization is responsible
- 9 for all costs involved in the removal and reinterment of the
- 10 remains.
- 11 SECTION 2. Subsection (b), Section 711.012, Health and
- 12 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The Texas Funeral Service Commission may adopt rules,
- 14 establish procedures, and prescribe forms to enforce and administer
- 15 Sections 711.003, 711.008, 711.010, 711.011, 711.021-711.035,
- 16 711.038, 711.0395, 711.041, 711.042, 711.061, and 711.062 relating
- 17 to cemeteries that are not perpetual care cemeteries.
- 18 SECTION 3. Section 711.038, Health and Safety Code, is
- amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 20 (f) A cemetery organization may not resell the exclusive
- 21 right of sepulture in a plot unless the exclusive right of sepulture
- 22 has been reacquired by the cemetery organization. A sanction or
- 23 other penalty may not be imposed on a cemetery organization that
- violates this subsection unless:

- 1 (1) the state agency authorized to enforce this
- 2 section provides the cemetery organization written notice of the
- 3 violation; and
- 4 (2) the cemetery organization does not correct the
- 5 violation before the 91st day after the date on which the cemetery
- 6 organization received the notice.
- 7 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 711, Health and Safety
- 8 Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0395 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 711.0395. MULTIPLE INTERMENTS IN SAME PLOT. A
- 10 cemetery organization may not make more than one interment in a plot
- 11 unless each owner of the plot consents to the interment.
- 12 SECTION 5. Subchapter A, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
- 13 Code, is amended by adding Section 716.0035 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 716.0035. ACCEPTANCE OF REMAINS. A crematory
- 15 establishment may accept deceased human remains for refrigeration
- 16 before it receives authorization to cremate the remains under
- 17 Subchapter B.
- SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
- 19 Code, is amended by adding Section 716.054 to read as follows:
- Sec. 716.054. EXCEPTION; WRITTEN DIRECTIONS. (a) This
- 21 section applies and a cremation authorization form is not required
- 22 under this chapter if:
- 23 (1) the deceased person has left written directions
- 24 for the disposition by cremation of the deceased person's human
- remains as provided by Section 711.002(g); and
- 26 (2) the authorizing agent refuses for any reason to
- 27 sign a cremation authorization form.

- 1 (b) The crematory establishment may cremate the deceased
- 2 person's human remains without receipt of a cremation authorization
- 3 form signed by the authorizing agent if:
- 4 (1) cremation costs are paid; and
- 5 (2) the authorizing agent provides positive written
- 6 identification that the human remains to be cremated are the human
- 7 remains of the deceased person.
- 8 SECTION 7. Section 716.101, Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 716.101. UNIDENTIFIED HUMAN REMAINS. (a) Except as
- 11 provided by Subsection (b), a [A] crematory establishment may not
- 12 accept for cremation unidentified human remains.
- 13 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a
- 14 <u>crematory establishment may accept for cremation unidentified</u>
- 15 human remains from a county on the order of:
- 16 (1) the county commissioners court; or
- 17 (2) a court located in the county.
- 18 SECTION 8. Section 716.103, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 716.103. IDENTIFICATION RESPONSIBILITY OF CREMATORY.
- 21 (a) A crematory establishment shall place on the exterior of a
- 22 cremation container a label with the deceased person's name as
- 23 provided by the authorizing agent unless the crematory
- 24 establishment knows the name is incorrect.
- 25 (b) A crematory establishment shall place, with the
- 26 <u>cremated remains</u>, in the temporary container, urn, or other
- 27 permanent container, a permanent metal identification disc,

- 1 bracelet, or other item that can be used to identify the deceased
- 2 person.
- 3 SECTION 9. Subsection (a), Section 716.104, Health and
- 4 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) Except as provided by Section 716.054, a [A] funeral
- 6 director or funeral establishment shall provide a signed written
- 7 statement to a crematory establishment that the human remains
- 8 delivered to the crematory establishment were positively
- 9 identified as the deceased person listed on the cremation
- 10 authorization form by the authorizing agent or a representative of
- 11 the authorizing agent delegated as provided by Section 716.053.
- 12 SECTION 10. Subsection (d), Section 716.152, Health and
- 13 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 (d) To the extent practicable, the crematory establishment
- shall remove all recoverable cremation residue from the cremation
- 16 chamber following cremation and pulverize any bone fragments to a
- 17 particle size of one-eighth inch or less as necessary. The
- 18 crematory establishment shall remove and dispose of any other
- 19 material included with the residue.
- SECTION 11. Subsection (a), Section 716.156, Health and
- 21 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) A crematory establishment shall:
- 23 (1) release the cremated remains to a representative
- 24 of the funeral establishment that delivered the deceased human
- 25 remains to the crematory establishment;
- 26 (2) release the cremated remains to the person
- 27 authorized to receive the remains on the cremation authorization

- 1 form; [or]
- 2 (3) ship the remains to the shipping address provided
- 3 by the authorizing agent on the cremation authorization form not
- 4 later than the 30th day following the date of cremation; or
- 5 (4) release the cremated remains according to written
- 6 directions for the disposition by cremation of the deceased
- 7 person's human remains as provided by Section 711.002(g).
- 8 SECTION 12. Subchapter E, Chapter 716, Health and Safety
- 9 Code, is amended by adding Section 716.204 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 716.204. IMMUNITY FROM CRIMINAL AND CIVIL LIABILITY;
- 11 WRITTEN DIRECTIONS. (a) In this section:
- 12 (1) "Cemetery organization" has the meaning assigned
- 13 by Section 711.001.
- (2) "Embalmer" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 15 651.001, Occupations Code.
- (b) If Section 716.054(a) applies, a cemetery organization,
- 17 <u>a business operating a crematory or columbarium, a funeral</u>
- director, an embalmer, or a funeral establishment is not criminally
- 19 liable or liable in a civil action for:
- 20 (1) cremating the human remains of a deceased person;
- 21 <u>or</u>
- 22 (2) carrying out the written directions of the
- 23 <u>deceased person.</u>
- SECTION 13. Section 716.304, Health and Safety Code, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 716.304. SCATTERING REMAINS. A person may scatter
- 27 cremated remains over uninhabited public land, over a public

- 1 waterway or sea, or on the private property of a consenting owner [7]
- 2 if the remains are reduced to a particle size of one-eighth inch or
- 3 less]. Unless the container is biodegradable, the cremated remains
- 4 must be removed from the container before being scattered.
- 5 SECTION 14. Subsection (a), Section 716.351, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person commits an offense if the person:
- 8 (1) cremates human remains without receipt of:
- 9 $\underline{\text{(A)}}$ a cremation authorization form signed by an
- 10 authorizing agent; or
- 11 (B) written directions for the disposition by
- 12 cremation of the deceased person's human remains as provided in
- 13 <u>Section 711.002(g)</u>;
- 14 (2) signs a cremation authorization form with actual
- 15 knowledge that the form contains false or incorrect information; or
- 16 (3) represents to the public that the person may
- 17 cremate human remains without being licensed as provided by
- 18 Subchapter N, Chapter 651, Occupations Code.
- 19 SECTION 15. Subsection (a), Section 651.154, Occupations
- 20 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) The commission shall set the following fees in amounts
- 22 reasonable and necessary to administer this chapter:
- 23 (1) the funeral director's and embalmer's application
- 24 fee, license fee, duplicate license fee, and reciprocal license
- 25 fee; and
- 26 (2) the cemetery, crematory, or funeral establishment
- 27 license fee, renewal fee, and late renewal penalty.

- 1 SECTION 16. Section 651.156, Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 3 (d) A subpoena or subpoena duces tecum issued under this
- 4 section is not effective unless it is issued in compliance with:
- 5 (1) state and federal law; and
- 6 (2) commission rules adopted under Subsection (c).
- 7 SECTION 17. Subsection (d), Section 651.165, Occupations 8 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (d) A person whose license has been expired for one year or
- 10 more may [not] renew the license by:
- 11 (1) retaking and passing the applicable examination;
- 12 (2) paying any applicable fees, including a renewal
- 13 fee that is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee;
- 14 and
- 15 (3) completing any continuing education required
- 16 <u>under Section 651.266</u>. [The person may obtain a new license by
- 17 complying with the requirements and procedures, including the
- 18 examination requirements, for obtaining an original license.
- 19 SECTION 18. Subchapter D, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 651.1655 to read as follows:
- Sec. 651.1655. REINSTATEMENT OF SUSPENDED LICENSE. A
- 22 person whose license has been suspended may renew the license by
- 23 paying to the commission a renewal fee that is equal to two times
- 24 the normally required renewal fee in addition to any penalty
- 25 assessed by the commission.
- SECTION 19. The heading to Section 651.267, Occupations
- 27 Code, is amended to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 651.267. REISSUANCE OF REVOKED LICENSE.
- 2 SECTION 20. Subsections (a) and (d), Section 651.267,
- 3 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) On application, the commission may reissue a license
- 5 issued under this subchapter to a person whose license has been
- 6 [suspended or] revoked. An application to reissue a license may not
- 7 be made before the $\underline{\text{third}}$ [first] anniversary of the date of the
- 8 [suspension or] revocation.
- 9 (d) A license that has been revoked [or suspended for a
- 10 period of five years or more] may be reinstated only after the
- 11 applicant:
- 12 (1) retakes and passes the applicable examination;
- 13 (2) pays a fee that is equal to two times the normally
- 14 required renewal fee; and
- 15 (3) satisfies any other commission requirements,
- 16 including any continuing education requirements under Section
- 17 651.266.
- SECTION 21. Subsection (e), Section 651.304, Occupations
- 19 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (e) The commission by rule shall prescribe reporting
- 21 requirements for provisional license holders. The commission
- 22 shall furnish report forms to be used by a provisional license
- 23 holder.
- SECTION 22. Subsections (d) and (f), Section 651.351,
- Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 26 (d) A funeral establishment must:
- 27 (1) meet the building, fire safety, and health

- 1 standards and health ordinances of this state and of the
- 2 municipality in which the establishment is located;
- 3 (2) be located at a fixed place that is not tax-exempt
- 4 property or a cemetery;
- 5 (3) include facilities in which funeral services may
- 6 be conducted;
- 7 (4) have access to rolling stock consisting of at
- 8 least one motor hearse;
- 9 (5) include a preparation room containing the
- 10 facilities, equipment, and supplies required by commission rule to
- 11 ensure the provision of adequate embalming services;
- 12 (6) include other facilities as necessary to comply
- 13 with the sanitary codes of this state and of the municipality in
- 14 which the room is located; and
- 15 (7) include a display containing sufficient
- 16 merchandise to permit reasonable selection, including at least five
- 17 adult caskets, two of which must be full-size and displayed in a
- 18 casket showroom.
- 19 (f) The least expensive casket displayed under Subsection
- 20 (d)(7) must be a full-size casket displayed in the same general
- 21 manner as the other full-size caskets are displayed. The three
- 22 <u>adult caskets that are not required to be full-size under</u>
- 23 <u>Subsection (d)(7) may be displayed:</u>
- 24 <u>(1) in a partial panel display; or</u>
- 25 (2) by video or brochure, online, or in any other
- 26 manner.
- 27 SECTION 23. Subsection (d), Section 651.353, Occupations

- 1 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 2 (d) This section does not apply to:
- 3 (1) a family, fraternal, or community cemetery that is
- 4 not larger than 10 acres;
- 5 (2) an unincorporated association of plot owners not
- 6 operated for profit;
- 7 (3) a church, a religious society or denomination, or
- 8 an entity solely administering the temporalities of a church or
- 9 religious society or denomination; [or]
- 10 (4) a public cemetery owned by this state, a county, or
- 11 a municipality; or
- 12 <u>(5)</u> a perpetual care cemetery.
- 13 SECTION 24. Subsections (a), (c), and (d), Section 651.354,
- Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The commission shall mail written notice to a cemetery
- 16 or funeral establishment of the impending expiration of the
- 17 establishment's license not later than the 30th day before the
- 18 expiration date of the license. The [Except as provided by
- 19 Subsection (d), the] notice must state that:
- 20 (1) to renew the license, the cemetery or funeral
- 21 establishment must pay the renewal fee not later than the license
- 22 <u>expiration date</u> [September 30]; and
- 23 (2) the license is automatically renewed on receipt of
- the renewal fee.
- (c) If the license is expired for longer than 30 days, the
- 26 cemetery or funeral establishment [may not renew the license and]
- 27 may not operate as a cemetery or funeral establishment until the

- 1 renewal fee and the late payment penalty are paid [establishment is
- 2 issued a new license in the manner provided for issuing an original
- 3 license].
- 4 (d) This section does not apply to [To renew a license for] a
- 5 perpetual care cemetery[, the cemetery must submit a renewal on a
- 6 form prescribed by the commission. The license is renewed or
- 7 receipt of the form by the commission].
- 8 SECTION 25. Subchapter H, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 651.355 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 651.355. PERPETUAL CARE CEMETERY REGISTRATION.
- 11 (a) The Texas Department of Banking shall provide annually to the
- 12 commission a list of perpetual care cemeteries, including the
- 13 address and other contact information for each cemetery. The
- 14 commission shall annually register each perpetual care cemetery on
- 15 that list.
- (b) A perpetual care cemetery is not required to pay a
- 17 <u>registration fee or renewal fee under this chapter.</u>
- SECTION 26. Subchapter J, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
- amended by adding Section 651.461 to read as follows:
- Sec. 651.461. DEFENSE TO VIOLATION. A person licensed
- 21 under this chapter does not violate this chapter by engaging in
- 22 conduct regarding funeral arrangements under the direction of a
- 23 person who:
- 24 <u>(1) represents to the license holder that the person</u>
- is authorized to make funeral arrangements for the deceased; and
- 26 (2) provides written directions to the license holder
- in the manner provided by Section 711.002, Health and Safety Code.

- 1 SECTION 27. Subsection (a), Section 651.507, Occupations 2 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- The commission or an administrative law judge employed 3 (a) by the State Office of Administrative Hearings shall review each 4 disciplinary proceeding to determine whether the license holder has 5 previously violated [committed] the same provision of this chapter 6 7 or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation on one or more previous occasions]. If it is determined that the license holder 8 9 has previously violated [committed] the same provision of this 10 chapter or rule adopted under this chapter [type of violation], the 11 commission or administrative law judge shall impose a disciplinary action that is more severe than that imposed on the previous 12
- SECTION 28. Subsection (d), Section 651.658, Occupations
 Code, is amended to read as follows:
 - (d) If the license is expired for longer than 30 days, the crematory establishment may not operate a crematory until the renewal fee and late payment penalty are paid [A person may not renew a license that has been expired for more than 30 days. A person holding a license that has been expired for more than 30 days must apply for a new license as required by this subchapter to conduct a crematory business].
- 23 SECTION 29. The following are repealed:

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- 24 (1) Subsection (b), Section 716.004, Health and Safety 25 Code; and
- 26 (2) Subsections (b) and (c), Section 651.304,
- 27 Subdivision (3), Section 651.651, and Subsection (d), Section

- 1 651.656, Occupations Code.
- 2 SECTION 30. Subsection (m), Section 711.004, Health and
- 3 Safety Code, as added by this Act, applies only to costs incurred as
- 4 a result of an error that occurs on or after the effective date of
- 5 this Act. Costs incurred as a result of an error that occurred
- 6 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 7 effect at the time the error occurred, and the former law is
- 8 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 31. Subsection (d), Section 651.165, Section
- 10 651.354, and Subsection (d), Section 651.658, Occupations Code, as
- 11 amended by this Act, apply only to a license that expires on or
- 12 after the effective date of this Act. A license that expired before
- 13 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at
- 14 the time the license expired, and the former law is continued in
- 15 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 32. Section 651.1655, Occupations Code, as added by
- 17 this Act, applies only to a license suspended on or after the
- 18 effective date of this Act. A license suspended before the
- 19 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the
- 20 time the license was suspended, and the former law is continued in
- 21 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 33. Section 651.267, Occupations Code, as amended
- 23 by this Act, applies only to a license revoked on or after the
- 24 effective date of this Act. A license revoked before the effective
- 25 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the
- license was revoked, and the former law is continued in effect for
- that purpose.

- 1 SECTION 34. Not later than January 1, 2008, the Texas
- 2 Department of Banking shall provide the initial list of perpetual
- 3 care cemeteries to the Texas Funeral Service Commission as required
- 4 by Section 651.355, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 35. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
